Scantron's Performance Series Express assessment delivers subject-level diagnostic results suitable for multiple measures that you can use to reduce testing time and avoid test overload.

- Q: Can my school district transition from Performance Series Standard (PSS) to Performance Series Express (PSE)?
- A: Yes. Starting in the 2019-2020 school year, school districts in Alabama will be able to choose which format of Performance Series they would like to utilize. Before deciding, please be sure to review all of the differences between the two assessments located on the front of this document.
- Q: Is there a cost associated with using **Performance Series Express?**
- A: The cost of PSE is included in the current contract with the Alabama State Department of Education; thus, there is no additional cost to individual schools or districts.
- Q: How will the enrollment from my student information system be imported into **Performance Series Express?**
- A: The same method used to import student information into PSS will be used for PSE. Simply put, automatic enrollment for PSE will mirror that of PSS.
- Q: Will I use the same Site ID for PSE that I currently use for PSS?
- A: No, you will have a separate Site ID for PSE. However, the Student ID, default Teacher User Name, and default Teacher Password will remain the same for both sites.
- Q: If my school has used Performance Series for multiple years, can my students' data be transferred into PSE?
- A: No, because the methods for calculating the results of PSE and PSS are specific to each assessment, the data from the two sites should not be compared, merged, or transferred. Growth calculations are also not interchangeable between PSS and PSE assessments.

- Q: Are the scores in PSE as reliable as the scores in PSS?
- A: PS Express is a reliable measure of student performance. The major difference between PSE and PSS is the number of items used in both assessments. Due to the different number of items used, the resulting Standard Error of Measure (SEM) also differs. In PSS, the average SEM observed is approximately 60 points while the average observed SEM for PSE is approximately 84 points.

All other psychometric properties related to the test items remain the same, since the same items are used in both exams. Essentially, PSE is a shortened version of PSS. It is backed by the same capabilities as a full-form assessment.

- Q: Can my school/district use PSS and PSE at the same time?
- A: The simple answer is YES. However, each student should only be tested in one site or the other, not both. Schools and districts may choose to utilize PSE for certain grades or for special populations, and still utilize PSS for other grades or populations. The key to remember is that data is non-transferrable between the two sites and should not be compared.
- Q: Will all of the reports in PSS be available in PSE?
- A: Yes, you will have access to the same reports.
- Q: If I am interested in using PSE in my school district, who do I contact for implementation?
